


# SAFE HARBOUR

- MODE
  - firewalled system
  - no connection to the Internet
  - limited access
  - ❖ local services (Wiki, NFS, Jabber, ...)
  - X Platform

# PERISCOPE - MODE

- Acts as a proxy
- \* (Wireless) Access Point
- VPN connections only
- All previous services shutdown
- Future Feature: network coy
